1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, citizens of Portland. This is Jerry Wilson, your Mayor. As you know, Port Elementary School has opened, and it is so nice to hear the kids playing. To ensure the safety of the students at the school, we've been communicating with the New Jersey State Police and requested that they enforce speed limits in the area around the school. This is in response to the many complaints City Hall has received regarding excessive speeding, especially in front of the school. Please obey speed limits for the safety of the kids and your fellow citizens. Thank you for your cooperation. Stay safe and healthy.

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Lily, what's wrong? Are you all right?

W: Oh, it's nothing.

M: Are you sure? You look pretty worried.

W: Actually, I said something mean to my sister and I feel really bad about it.

M: What did you say to her?

W: I said she's the worst sister because she wore my favorite jacket again!

M: Jeez! She must have been really hurt by that.

W: Yeah, but I told her not to wear my jacket a million times. She never listens.

M: Still, you should be more careful when you talk to someone close to you.

W: I know, but I was so angry.

M: People get hurt more easily when someone close to them says mean things.

W: Yeah, you're right. I'll apologize to her when I get home.

W: Hi, listeners! Now we have one person on the line. He has something special to share with us. Hello, you're on the air!

M: I'm Jin, a high school student. I'm a big fan of the show.

W: Thank you, Jin. By the way, you left a message on our website, didn't you?

M: Yes. Today is my parents' 20th wedding anniversary. I wanted to honor them on the show.

W: I see. Are your parents listening now?

M: Yes, they listen to your show every day.

W: That's great. What is your message to your parents?

M: Hmm... Mom and Dad, you're amazing parents. Happy Anniversary to you both!

W: What a lovely message! Thank you for calling us today, Jin.

M: Thanks again for taking my call.

4. 대화를 듣고, 그림에서 대화의 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

W: Hi, Tim. How's everything going with the festival?

M: Hey, Julie! It's going great. This is a picture of what our booth will look like.

W: What will people do at your booth?

M: They'll be asked to answer questions and be given snacks if they answer correctly.

W: Okay, that sounds good. I like the banner that says 'Guessing Time' in the center.

M: Thanks. What do you think about the photos that are under the clock?

W: Great idea! What are you using the round table for?

M: We're going to put the snacks on it.

W: That makes sense. Then, what about the globe on the floor?

M: It's for choosing countries. We're going to ask people geography questions.

W: That should be interesting. What's that crown on the left side?

M: That's a photo zone for all participants.

W: Cool. I can't wait for this year's festival!

5. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Kasey, how's everything coming along for grandma's birthday this Sunday?

W: Hey, dad. I wrote a card for her and got some decorations yesterday.

M: That's good!

W: Have you gotten anything for her yet?

M: I already bought a sweater. Can I help with decorating the living room for the party?

W: Clara will take care of that. Also, she's picking up a birthday cake.

M: Awesome! Your grandma will be so happy because you guys are going to make her birthday so special.

W: I hope so. What about food? What can we make for her?

M: How about grilled salmon sandwiches? She loves those!

W: Good idea, but I won't have time to handle that on my own.

M: Then, I'll order salmon and vegetables online today.

W: Thanks, dad! That's a big help.

M: Sounds good. Do you want any toppings on your ice cream? We have chocolate chips and crunchy nuts. Toppings cost \$1 each.

W: Oh, yes. I'll have crunchy nuts only on the medium and nothing on the small cups.

M: Good choice. Do you need anything else?

W: No, that's it.

M: How would you like to pay? Cash or credit?

W: I'll pay with my credit card.

M: Mom, I'm home.

M: I was. It's actually been fun.

W: Then why didn't you renew your membership?

M: Well, the shower facilities at the gym are too old, and there's not enough space in the shower stalls.

W: I see. Why don't you check out the new health club nearby? It may be more expensive, but the facilities are probably a lot better.

M: Okay. Maybe I should visit there tomorrow on my way home after school.

W: That sounds like a good plan!

8. 대화를 듣고, Tour of Liberty University에 관해 언급되지 않은 것을 고르시오.

W: Hey, Bruce! I'm going to take a tour of Liberty University. Do you want to come?

M: Absolutely! That's one of the schools that I'm interested in. When is the tour?

W: There's one on October 3rd and another one on October 10th. They're both Saturdays. Which date is better for you?

M: October 10th is better for me. What will we do during the tour?

W: We'll get to see the campus in the morning and then we'll meet with an admissions counselor in the afternoon. You can ask them questions about the admissions process when we see them.

M: Okay, then I should make a list of questions. I have a lot of things to ask them.

W: That's a good idea. Also, everyone who goes on the tour will get a free Liberty University T-shirt as a souvenir.

M: Really? That's cool. So how do I sign up for the tour?

W: You can sign up on their website.

M: Okay, I will do that. Thank you so much for telling me about it.

W: Everyone loves a good night's sleep, but for wild animals, finding the right time and place can be difficult. Whether it's staying safe, keeping warm, or remembering to breathe, animals have a lot to consider before they go to bed. As a result, they've come up with some clever and interesting solutions. To start with, bats sleep in caves while hanging upside down. Doing that not only keeps them away from enemies but also means they are in the perfect position to fly away if necessary. Meanwhile, ducks sleep side by side in rows. The ducks on the outside of the rows sleep with one eye open to watch for danger, while the ducks on the inside sleep with both eyes closed. Giraffes require little rest, sleeping for only five minutes at a time or as little as 30 minutes a day. They sleep in short intervals, sometimes sitting down or even standing up, so that they're ready to run. Finally, dolphins have to consciously think in order to breathe, even when they're sleeping. They only let part of their brain relax and keep one eye open as they sleep.
