1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Good morning, students. This is your principal. I'd like to share an important announcement with you today. Recently, we have noticed that many students use AI too much for their assignments. While AI can be helpful, assignments should still reflect each student's own thinking and effort. Students should use AI responsibly and not copy answers directly from it. For this reason, starting next month, we'll introduce an AI-detection system to limit the overuse of AI. This system will ensure that you don't rely on AI alone but instead use it responsibly as a learning tool. Thank you for listening.

2. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Hey, Jake. Did you apologize to your sister today?

M: Yeah, Mom. I told her I was sorry.

W: And did she accept it?

M: No, she just walked away.

W: What exactly did you say?

M: I said, "I'm sorry, but I only yelled because you kept bothering me."

W: Jake, that's not a real apology.

M: Why not? I said I was sorry.

W: When you apologize, you shouldn't make excuses. If you want her to accept your apology, say sorry without defending yourself, and actually mean it.

M: Then, do you think I should apologize one more time?

W: Yes. Sincerely say you're sorry, without any excuses.

M: Okay. I'll try again.

3. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 요지로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, teachers! Welcome back to Great Teachers Tips! When you teach a new concept, do your students look confused? Here's a simple tip: use something familiar as an example. When you connect an idea to something students already know, you can help students understand the idea more easily. For example, when you introduce paragraph structure as a new concept, compare it to a hamburger: the top bun is the topic sentence, the meat and vegetables are the details, and the bottom bun is the closing sentence. Try this tip for effective teaching.

W: Hello, Fresh Living subscribers. Every year, tons of food are thrown away just because we didn't store it the right way. Today, I'd like to talk about how we can lower food waste by storing food in the proper way. First, don't put onions in the refrigerator because they soften easily. Store them in a cool, dry place with good airflow. Next, keep cabbage in the refrigerator's vegetable drawer. It lasts longer when you don't remove the outer leaves which protect the inner part from drying out. And what about bread? If you want to keep it fresher for longer, store it in the freezer. Finally, mushrooms go bad fast since they take in water easily. Keeping them in a paper bag makes them stay dry and fresh for a longer time. With these simple tips, we can keep our food fresh and less food goes into the trash. Have a good day.
