3. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Hi, welcome to our podcast, Urbansafety. This is your host, Grace Garland. Most people know that driving under the influence of alcohol is extremely dangerous. But many people don't realize that driving after taking certain types of medicine can be just as unsafe. Some drugs have side effects such as making you sleepy or making it hard to concentrate. These drugs could make you react more slowly than you normally would, and this could lead to fatal car accidents. So, when your doctor prescribes a medication, ask about how it can affect your ability to drive and don't drive until you find out exactly how that drug affects you. Be safe on the road by keeping these things in mind.
