[16 ~ 17] 다음을 듣고, 물음에 답하시오.

W: Hello, everyone. Last time, we talked about the conditions of current hiking trails. Today, let's talk about the factors we need to think about when we choose the surface materials for public park trails. The most important factor is safety. Soil and sand don't offer stable support for wheelchair users, so we need to mix in some hardening materials. The second thing to consider is the budget for construction and maintenance. For example, bricks are more expensive than hardened soil, but brick trails require less money and work to maintain. Lastly, you need to take into account the climate. For example, wood is likely to rot in the wet weather so it's not good for public park trails where rain is frequent. Also, asphalt will melt down in hot weather, which makes it a bad choice for the public park in a hot area. We'll talk about those materials more in detail after we watch a video.
