1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, visitors to Cryston Beach. This is an announcement from the management office. As you know, this beach is famous for its beautiful black stones. Unfortunately, there were some cases where visitors damaged the beach by taking stones. To protect the beach, you must not take any stones from the beach. M: Welcome back to the Music and Life course. Songs are known to have several functions. Today, we're learning about how songs are used at a variety of places to create group unity.
